

## TRY GEOCACHING WHILE HIKING!

## WHAT IS GEOCACHING?

It's a real-world, outdoor treasure hunting game using GPS-enabled devices. Participants navigate to a specific set of GPS coordinates and then attempt to find the geocache hidden at that location.

### **HOW IS THE GAME PLAYED?**

- 1. Register for a free basic membership at www.geocaching.com.
- 2. Visit the "Hide & Seek a cache" page.
- 3. Enter the postal code in which you want to explore and click "search".
- 4. Choose any geocache from the list and click on its name.
- 5. Enter the coordinates of the geocache into your smart phone app or GPS device. Use it to find the hidden geocache.
- 6. In the geocache there will be a logbook. Sign it and return the geocache to its original location.
- 7. Share your geocaching stories and photos online

### WHAT ARE THE RULES?

- 1. If you take something from the geocache, leave something of equal or greater value
- 2. Write about your find in the cache logbook
- 3. Log your experience at www.geocaching.com

## WHAT DO I NEED?

The only necessities are a GPS device or a GPS-enabled mobile phone, so that you can navigate to the cache, and a geocaching membership.

## WHERE ARE GEOCACHES LOCATED?

Caches can be found all over the world. It's common for geocachers to hide caches in locations that are important to them, reflecting a special interest or skill of the cache owner. These locations can be quite diverse. They may be at your local park, at the end of a long hike, underwater, or on the side of a city street.



# Red Cat Cellars HIKING TRAIL OVERVIEW

Hiking in the Finger Lakes Region is a beautiful and educational experience. Step onto the hillside at Hazlitt's Red Cat Cellars and you will find yourself standing in old abandoned vineyards on the site that once was the storied and historic Widmer Wine Cellars.

Please be sure to stop at the wine and gift shop for some local knowledge before you start. There, you will also be able to purchase water and snacks for your hike. The trail is beautiful, invigorating and has great natural scenery. The uneven ground along with steep inclines call for decent hiking shoes and appropriate attire. Leave the flip-flops and bathing suits in the car. Bring your camera as there are some great views. Please stay on the marked trail and be sure to keep a watchful eye out for poison ivy. Please do not attempt to feed the animals. They are best viewed at a safe distance.

## **HIKING TRAIL GUIDELINES**


- IMPORTANT: There is an Active Honeybee Hive along trail that is marked. USE CAUTION IN THIS AREA.
- PLEASE DON'T FEED THE WILDLIFE.
- TRAIL CLOSES AT DUSK.
- · Wear proper hiking shoes and attire.
- · Dress for the weather.
- · Please stay on marked trail.
- The ground is uneven, please watch your step.
- On the street, please hike facing on coming traffic.
- DO NOT LITTER. Leave with everything you brought.
- · Look out for Poison Ivy.

- 1. Hazlitt's Red Cat Cellars' Wine and Gift Shop / Tasting Room
- 2. Chalet and Handicap Accessible Tasting Room
- 3. The Original Homestead

The Homestead was built in 1885. The basement was used for wine production when the wine business was started in 1888.

4. The Brick Barn

Home to the Widmer family, this house can now be rented for your vacation in historic Naples. For more details ask at the gift shop.

#### 6. The Carriage House

#### 7. The Sherry Building

Formerly a canning business, the building was purchased by Widmer to age and bottle Sherry, a tradition that continues today.

#### 8. The Press Plant

In 1915, Widmer purchased the Kenney Basket Factory and converted it into part of the winery. This is now the building where we press grapes to begin the winemaking process!
